VACCINATIONS POLICY

Measles, Mumps and Rubella

New York State law requires that any person born on or after January 1, 1957, who is registered to attend or attends classes at a degree granting institution, whether full or part-time, must submit proof of immunity to measles, mumps and rubella.

Meningococcal Disease

New York State law also requires institutions, including colleges and universities, to distribute information about meningococcal disease and immunization to the students, or parents/guardians of students under the age of 18, accompanied by a response form. The institution is required to maintain appropriate documentation for each student.
